

AFTER 14 WEEKS...

After 14 weeks of classes and practical sessions from January to April, Moses and his students gathered in Limuru town, just outside Nairobi, for a half-day retreat.

It was a refreshing opportunity to reflect on their journey of making disciples and becoming leaders of integrity. This meeting was a reminder to motivate students to carry the message beyond the classroom and into their communities. We will share what the LORD has done through these dedicated students.

Wesley: Inspired a remarkable mobilization of 80 people from his church for 3 days to reach his target area in Kutele, a village in Narok County. He divided his team into three groups, employing strategies such as door-to-door evangelism, open-air crusades, evening revival meetings, and even a cinema outreach featuring The Jesus Film. He joyfully reported, "our original target of reaching 70 people was surpassed by over 150 individuals, exceeding our expectations. 44 people prayed to receive Christ." With this success, Wesley and his team are establishing a training center to empower and equip new believers for their faith journey.





Martin (Adam): In our February edition, we featured a story about Adam* (whose real name is Martin), a politician and our student who is passionate about making a positive difference in his community. Martin became a Christian in the course of the class and is being disciplined by Moses. He reaches out to 160 students in his community. He said "I accepted to give my life to Jesus one month ago. I am glad I did. I want to disciple students from diverse backgrounds, majority are from single parent families who are poor and rarely find it easy to associate with others in worship."

Lisa: A communications specialist is discipling five young people. She said, "the greatest strength of my ministry was the deep relational connections we forged. Through weekly one-on-one meetings, shared meals, and intentional prayer, we created a safe haven for mentees to explore their spiritual struggles. One participant expressed that our informal coffee meetings were more impactful than structured Bible studies."

Faith: A marketplace leader. She leads a team of six at work. She said, "After a deep dive into the meaning of discipleship and where it can take place, I felt incredibly challenged. I prayed and trusted God to guide me in starting a group at work, and I can confidently say this has been my best decision in the first quarter of 2025. Witnessing the progress of the group members, especially two who had never read the Bible, didn't pray, or attend any church, is truly inspiring. They are now embracing the word of God and developing a daily desire to share the new insights they are gaining."

KipKoeck: Formerly in telecoms and now a pastor said, "this semester my discipleship ministry flourished through strong personal connections among group members. I encouraged honest discussions about personal challenges and faith. Leading by example, I shared my own journey of growth through faith and failure, which inspired significant progress during our weekly meetings."

He continued, "the culture of prayer and biblical support blossomed, transforming lives. One member shared how our acceptance helped her overcome shame and embrace her true self. Together, we are growing in faith and love."

Moses and I are grateful to God for this testimonies and are reminded of Acts 20:24; "...I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace."
