MENS' RETREAT IN KAJIADO COUNTY

Fifteen men, including our Vice Chancellor and his deputy, attended the university's three-day retreat for men tagged “Man Enough.” “Man Enough” is a Bible study series that challenges men to walk deeper with the Lord, discover their God-given purpose, and be accountable to each other. Upon arrival in Kajiado county, we were hosted by a Maasai family right in the heart of Kenya's Rift Valley for the weekend. We learned about their culture, values, and resilience in life. The retreat created a bond of fellowship and shared experience. It was a great opportunity to learn from the LORD and hold each other accountable.

On the second day, we set out on a 23-kilometer hike. We were probably about 2,000 feet on the hill when someone said, “Life is not a walk in the park.” This is true. Life is a journey and as men, we are to embrace it. Our journey took us up the hill to visit and encourage a family who were believers in Christ, living out their calling in Maasai land. It was such an encouraging time. The family's dedication and faithfulness was inspiring, and it was a privilege to learn from them. After the fellowship, we returned to our base down hill.

For most of the men on this trip, it was a weekend to remember. We also had the privilege of giving back to the Maasai community by offering leadership training opportunities to students and church pastors, further strengthening our sense of community.

We believe every man needs encouragement, godly wisdom, and grace to stand firm in a world that tends to tell men to hide their emotions and act tough. We learned that God's Word offers many examples of men who fervently and completely pursued God with all their hearts, minds, and souls! (1 Corinthians 16:13)
